MECCA DANCE HALL FOR THE TOWN CENTRE?

The large hall controlled by Basildon Development Corporation in the church Commissioner's block being built in the Town Centre may be taken over by Mecca for dancing. Only the shell of the hall will be there, and whoever takes possession will do their own decoration.

The General Manager of the Corporation (Mr R.C.C. Boniface) said this week: "Whoever runs it will complete it".

The No 2 car park, costing £30,000, in the north-east corner, should be finished in three months. The Corporation have in mind, at a later stage, properly attended car parks where a small fee will be charged.

The extension of Broadmayne from Timberlog Lane down to Pitsea will be started early next year.

W. and C. French who will build Fryerns Community Centre and Library, have been given the "go ahead".

Mecca dance hall open in Town Centre by autumn

MECCA, Ltd,. have taken over the hall in the Church Commissioner's block at the Town Centre. They are to spend about £50,000 on interior decorations, alterations and furnishing before opening it as a ballroom - probably in the early autumn.

Giving this news to a "Standard" reporter, Mr G. J. R. Bannet, secretary of Mecca, said they had taken out a 99 year lease on the hall. When it was opened there might be as many as five nights a week for dancing, while the hall would also be available for letting.

Heats of contests such as the "National Ballroom Queen," "Miss England" and "Miss United Kingdom" competitions, which Mecca help to sponsor, will undoubtedly be held in the ballroom. Mecca are providing the ballroom, which will be lavishly decorated and furnished, with a balcony.

Mr Bannett said that it had not yet been decided what nights would be set aside for dancing, but it was likely that teenagers would have an evening set aside for them.

Mecca also hoped to arrange for the ballroom to be let for functions such as works buffet-dances. There would be at least one letting night each week and possibly more.

One or perhaps two resident dance bands would be employed. Efforts would be made to cater for a variety of types of dancing. The ballroom would include a soft drinks bar and probably a licensed club.

Basildon will be the first New Town in which Mecca have opened a ballroom.

Situated in the market Pavement near the Town Centre. The fitters have been at work on the luxury - sprung floor of the Ballroom. Which will hold something like 1,000 dancers. The work should be finished early in March. Mr Green describes it as a modern dance hall with every amenity possible. The ladies' "boudoirs" are "second to none," and the men are also being looked after.

Rooms for "putting the crease back into those trousers" are a special feature, and there are facilities for Shaving.

CIVIC FUNCTION

The Ballroom itself has elegant lighting. At one end there is a magnificent Tudor Club.

Basildon's latest addition to the social scene will be opened on March 24th with a Basildon Urban District Council civic function, and on March 25th it will be open to general view from 11am until 5 o'clock. At 7.30pm on the same night Mecca will hold its first dance.



FREE CHURCHES LOSE FIGHT TO STOP LOCARNO DRINKS

No detrimental effect on teenagers

BASILDON'S Free Churches have lost their fight to stop intoxicating drinks being sold at the New Town's Locarno Ballroom. When an inquiry was held in November, the Churches said the drink's licence would have a detrimental effect on teenagers using the premises.

To fight their case were four ministers, Rev. R. C. Gibbins (superintendent of Basildon Methodist Church). Rev. W. Ralph Carr (Langdon Hills Methodist Church). Rev. Charles Phillimore (Fryerns Baptist Church) and Rev. Cyril Rusbridge (Kingswood Baptist Church).

Opposition was led by Mr H. Cecil Heath (President of the National United Temperance Council) who represented the Free Churches, Basildon Headteachers Association, Basildon Christian Teachers Fellowship and Basildon Welfare Committee.

Mr Heath said at the inquiry: "Where teenagers morals are concerned the greatest safeguard is not to provided alcohol at all." Quite a number of dance halls did good business without a bar. Announcing the result of the inquiry the Ministry of Housing and Local Government stated this week.: "In his report to the Minister the inspector summarised the representation made by, or on behalf of the licensed Premises Committee, Mecca Ltd, (the proprietors) and the objectors." He observed it was appropriate that some provision should be made for the sale of intoxicating drinks in premises such as the ballroom in the case and saw no practical difference between operating the on-licence as proposed and the present system which cannot be operated under the new licensing



SOUNDLY BASED

He concluded that the case for the licence was soundly based and recommended that the proposal be confirmed.

The Minister agreed with the Inspector's recommendation and noted that the objections mainly on the ground that licensing the ballroom would have a detrimental effect on teenagers using the premises, particularly those under 18 years of age.

The announcement continued: The Minister appreciates the proper concern shown by the objectors for the moral welfare of the ballroom's younger patrons, but is not persuaded that young people would in this respect be in any greater peril in a full-licensed premises.

He does not question that Mecca Ltd take more than usual precautions to ensure that no impropriety or breach of the law takes place on their premises, nor does he see any reason to doubt that the company will maintain in the future the high standard of management on which they have built their reputation.

CLERGY REACTION

"Regrettable" is the word Basildon Free Church leader Rev. Ronald Gibbins applies to the result of the Locarno drinks inquiry.


"I regret this decision," said Mr Gibbins, Minister of Trinity Methodist Church and principal witness for the opposition at the inquiry. I feel it will be detrimental to the young people of Basildon, for whom I have a very high regard."

He said the Free Church had made its stand for truth and social righteousness. "This means we shall have to watch the position much more carefully in future.

Rural Dean Rev. William Winfield refused to comment.

But Rev. Cyril Rushbridge, Minister of of Kingswood Baptist Church, "told the Standard": "I am not surprised at the result, I did not think we stood much chance, but still think we did the right thing to protest."



Date: Monday 24th December 1962 - Sunday 12th January 1964

The Dave Clark Five were formed in Tottenham, north London by stuntman turned drummer Dave Clark. The group first played the Locarno in 1962 where they provided both Christmas Eve and New Years Eve's entertainment. They then held down a very successful Sunday night residency that lasted throughout 1963 and into 1964. In January 1964 after around 56 dates the band switched Mecca venues to the Tottenham Royal in north London following the success of their second hit "Glad all Over", released in December 1963.

NEW LOOK FOR BALLROOM

The £50,000 face lift to the Locarno Ballroom in Basildon is under way. Work which will completely remodernise the dancehall started on Monday. It is expected to be completed in October. Manager Maurice Green pointed out: The work will not affect business in any way. It will be dancing as usual.

Standard Recorder August 1971

In 1970 the first change of name occurred when Mecca dropped the Locarno branding and the ball-room was renamed Tiffanys through to early March 1974 when following another refurbishment, it reopened under the name Raquels on 6th April. Sadly its time as Tiffanys was marred in 1972 following an incident that resulted in a fatality and criminal proceedings.

Mecca Ltd. had remained a dominant force within the leisure industry and by 1977 were operating over 100 nightclubs nationally. Their Basildon venue continued to host live acts like Edwin Starr, The Equals, Ben E. King, The Platters and Jamaican star Desmond Dekker, though name artistes became less frequent as time went on as the emphasis was geared towards DJ run disco evenings and a popular Monday evening 'Teen Scene' for the under eighteens.

During the 1980s the nightclub went through another refurbishment and subtle name change to Raquels II The Discotheque, and things continued much as before. The change of name adorned a new white backed black lined illuminated sign in the shape of an upturned isosceles triangle positioned high on the west facing wall. During this period, musician, producer and Pinkees band manager Keith Bonsoir was recruited as the main DJ. He would later go on in 1991 to found the Time discotheque in Time Square, Basildon. Other popular DJ's who worked the venue during this period were Robbie Vincent, Essex Radio's Dave Gregory and local man Micky Laudat.
